THIS WAS THE SITE OF A POPULAR ROADHOUSE WHERE THE PONIES OF THE CENTRAL OVERLAND FONY EXPRESS WERE CHANGED DURING JULY 1, 1860 - JUNE 30, 1861. FROM HERE THE ROUTE OF THE FONY RIDERS CONTINUED WESTWARD TO FOLSOM AND EASTWARD THROUGH RESQUE DRY CREEK CROSSING AND MISSOURI FLAT TO PLACERVILLE.
